REBECCA PENNEYS is a recitalist, chamber musician, orchestral soloist, educator, and adjudicator. For over six decades she has been hailed as a pianist of prodigious talent, has concertized throughout all the continents north of Antarctica, and represented the USA in Information Service State Department Cultural Tours over a ten-year period. She made her recital debut at age 9 and performed as soloist with the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra at 11. At 17 she received the unprecedented Special Critics' Prize at the VII International Chopin Piano Competition in Warsaw, an award created in her honor. Other prizes include Naumburg Chamber Music Award, on two separate occasions, Most Outstanding Musician Prize in Vianna Da Motta Competition, and top prize in Paloma O'Shea Competition. Critics worldwide have acclaimed her live performance and recordings. She made her NY Debut at Alice Tully Hall in 1972. An International Steinway Artist, she has received accolades for her ability to teach Motion and Emotion, an approach to keyboard technique that helps pianists achieve individual performance goals without physical strain or injury. In 2021 she was inducted into the Steinway Teachers Hall of Fame. Having completed 43 years of full-time collegiate teaching, she retired in 2017 and is now Professor Emerita of Piano at Eastman and courtesy Steinway-Artist-in-Residence at USF. She was Chautauqua Piano Chair for 34 years and started its chamber music program. Launched in 2013, RPPF, a tuition-free festival, is supported by Rebecca Penneys Friends of Piano, non-profit 501c3. Her many CDs, DVDs, HD performance/teaching videos, and Chicken Soup for Pianists are available on-line. Current and former students include prizewinners in international competitions and hold teaching posts worldwide. A graduate of Indiana University, Rebecca's teachers include Aube Tzerko, Leonard Stein, Rosina Lhevinne, Artur Rubinstein, Menahem Pressler, György Sebök, Janos Starker, and Josef Gingold.

FACULTY BIOGRAPHIES



Recipient of an Avery Fisher Career Grant and the Andrew Wolf Chamber Music Prize, Philadelphia-born LYDIA ARTYMIW has performed with over 100 orchestras world-wide including the Boston Symphony, Cleveland Orchestra, New York Philharmonic, Philadelphia Orchestra, Minnesota Orchestra, San Francisco Symphony, Pittsburgh Symphony, St. Louis Symphony, National Symphony, LA Philharmonic, and the St. Luke's and St. Paul Chamber Orchestras. She has performed solo recitals in most major American cities, important European music centers, and throughout the Far East. Critics have acclaimed her seven recordings for Chandos, and she has also recorded for Bridge, Centaur, and Naxos. Her debut Chandos "Variations" CD won Gramophone Magazine's "Best of the Year" award, and her recording of the "Complete Mendelssohn Cello/Piano Works" with cellist Marcy Rosen for Bridge was nominated for a 2018 Grammy. Festival appearances include Aspen, Bantry, Bravo! Vail, Caramoor, Chautauqua, Hollywood Bowl, Marlboro, Montréal, Mostly Mozart, RPPF, Seattle, and Tucson. Artymiw has collaborated with Yo-Yo Ma, Richard Stoltzman, Arnold Steinhardt, Kim Kashkashian, Benita Valente, and the Guarneri, Tokyo, American, Alexander, Borromeo, Miami, Orion, and Shanghai Quartets. A recipient of top prizes in the 1976 Leventritt and 1978 Leeds International Competitions, she graduated from Philadelphia's University of the Arts and studied with Gary Graffman for twelve years. Artymiw was a juror for the 2015 Cliburn Junior International Piano Competition, First China International Competition, Beijing (2019), 2017 Lang Lang Futian International Piano Competition, and the 2022 New York International Piano Competition. She has also been a juror for twenty piano concerto competitions at Juilliard and has been a frequent guest piano teacher at Juilliard since 2015. Artymiw was Distinguished McKnight Professor of Piano at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis from 1989-2020 and was awarded Emerita status. She received the 2015 "Excellence in Graduate Teaching" Award and the 2000 Dean's Medal. <u>lydiaartymiw.com</u>



KATHRYN BROWN has performed around the globe as concerto soloist, recitalist, and chamber musician. She gave her New York Recital Debut at Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall, and has appeared in concert at New York's 92nd Street Y. She was featured on the Dame Myra Hess Memorial Concert Series in Chicago, Cleveland's Severance Hall and the German Embassy, the Philips Collection, and the Library of Congress in Washington, D.C. International highlights include concerts at Prague's Rudolfinum Hall, the University of London, and the National Theatre in Ghana, Africa. A recipient of the Louis Sudler Prize for the Arts, Brown is an advocate of contemporary music, recording and premiering works by Menotti, Fitch, Tcimpidis, Brouwer, Hersch, and Pinscher. Pianist and co-founder of the Myriad Chamber Players, her chamber music credits include performances at the Marlboro Music Festival with members of the Guarneri String Quartet and Beaux Arts Trio. She has also performed with the Cavani String Quartet, members of the Lincoln Center Chamber Players, and The Verdehr Trio, and was featured with Dmitri Ashkenazy on Ravinia's Rising Stars series. She has been featured on the British Broadcasting Network, the PBS Artistry of... series, Chicago's WFMT Radio, and NPR's Performance Today. Her discography includes releases with Telarc, New World, Albany, and Crystal labels. An accomplished singer and recitalist, Brown's performances include premieres at Severance Hall with the Cleveland Orchestra and feature roles at the Aspen Music Festival and Tanglewood Music Center. She is an enthusiastic pedagogue and a frequent juror of competitions, nationally and internationally. With over 45 years of experience as a teacher of Dalcroze Eurhythmics and a lifelong performer of chamber music, TERRY BOYARSKY specializes in integrating music and movement into the curriculum. Her unique, multifaceted approach evokes deep listening and playful experimentation. Students work together to understand the components of rhythm and sound, develop attention, improve coordination, and challenge the mind. Her collaborations have spanned the United States, Canada, France, Switzerland, Thailand, and Venezuela. In 1998, Terry earned a M.A. in Ethnomusicology from Kent State University and has been listed in "Who's Who" since 2000. Recent articles include "Dalcroze Eurhythmics and the Quick Reaction Exercises" published in the Orff Echo, and "Encouraging Collaboration" published in the Dalcroze Society of America Connections. Terry frequently presents at national conferences, is a teaching artist with the Kennedy Center's Ohio State-Based Collaboratives, is on the Ohio Teaching Artist Roster, and is an artist for Creative Aging Ohio. She sings with the Cleveland Orchestra Blossom Festival Chorus and Choral Arts Society. Her solo piano program "Classical Expressions of the Folk Tradition" has been received with great acclaim. Terry teaches Vocal Music of Russia and the former USSR at Case Western Reserve University. Since 2007, Terry and Siberian balalaika virtuoso Oleg Kruglyakov have performed throughout North America as Russian Duo. terryboyarsky.blog



From Page, Arizona, Navajo pianist CONNOR CHEE is known for combining his classical piano training with his Navajo heritage. Chee began piano at age 6 with Sue Barney, and later Debbie Mitchell. At 10, his family relocated to Cincinnati, Ohio, where he attended the School for Creative and Performing Arts studying with Anna Weinstein and Simon Goykhman. At 12, Chee won a gold medal in the World Piano Competition's Young Artist Division, earning him his first performance at New York City's Carnegie Hall. In subsequent years, he won multiple awards in the World Piano Competition, earning performances at the United Nations, and an international feature on CNN. While in Cincinnati, Chee performed with the Cincinnati Pops, the Hamilton-Fairfield Symphony Orchestra, and the Blue Ash Montgomery Symphony Orchestra, At 17, he entered the Eastman School of Music under Professor Rebecca Penneys. He received his Bachelor of Music degree there in 2009, and his Master's degree from the University of Cincinnati's College Conservatory of Music with Professor Elizabeth Pridonoff. Chee was awarded First Prize in the 2016 Bradshaw & Buono International Piano Competition and performed in the winners' recital at Carnegie Hall. He has released 3 studio albums of original pieces and piano transcriptions of Navajo music. The Navajo Piano won Best Instrumental Recording at the 16th Annual Native American Music Awards, and his piece "Beginnings" won Best New Age Song. In addition to winning Best Instrumental Recording, Chee was nominated for Best New Artist and Record of the Year. His most recent release, Scenes from Dinétah, features piano pieces written about elements of Navajo life and culture and has been accompanied by several music videos filmed on the reservation. Chee is currently a voting member of The Recording Academy (GRAMMY® Awards) and continues to perform throughout the United States. connorchee.com



South Korean pianist HIEYON CHOI first appeared on the international piano music scene after winning prizes at Kapell, Epinal, Busoni and Viotti competitions. She has performed with prestigious orchestras in Europe, US and Korea such as Rundfunkorchester Berlin, National Symphony Orchestra, Northern Sinfonia, Seoul Philharmonic Orchestra and Korean Broadcast Symphony Orchestra. A milestone of her career was the four-year cycle of all 32 Beethoven piano sonatas at Kumho Art Hall in Seoul. For this series she received the 2005 Arts Award by the Korean Arts & Cultural Association. Ten years later she completed another Beethoven cycle, all piano trios, violin sonatas and works for cello and piano which took place in in Korea, Germany and the USA. HieYon has collaborated with renowned musicians Truls Mørk, Tsuyoshi Tsutsumi, Peter Stumph, Mark Kosower, Romain Guyot, Stephan Dohr, Ulf Wallin, Mikyung Lee, and Soovin Kim. A strong advocate of new music, HieYon was the inaugural Artist-in-Residence of Tong-Yeong International Music festival performing many contemporary works. HieYon led many contemporary music projects at SNU and in 1999 she joined the SNU piano faculty. HieYon continues to teach worldwide at the Guildhall Schoon (London), Ecole normale (Paris), top schools in Germany, China and USA.. HieYon has multiple albums with Decca Korea and for TV & radio the USA, Italy, Switzerland, Sweden, and Germany. She is a frequent guest at KBS classic radio which features her live lecture concerts. Born in Inchon, South Korea, HieYon debuted with the Inchon Philharmonic Orchestra at age 6. She won all four major competitions in Korea studying with Professor Joong-Won Koh. Subsequently she moved to Germany to study with Professors Klaus Hellwig and Hans Leygraf. She studied with Professor György Sebök at Indiana University. In 2023, HieYon joins the Peabody Institute of the Johns Hopkins University piano faculty. hieyonchoi.com/



ALAN CHOW has performed in recital and in concert with orchestra in nearly all fifty states, throughout Asia, and in Europe. He has been presented at New York's Lincoln Center and Merkin Hall, Chicago's Symphony Center and Ravinia, the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. and Vienna's MozartHaus. He has also appeared as soloist with the National, Pan Asian, Utah, Oakland, Kansas City, and Omaha Symphonies and the Hong Kong, Shanghai, and Tulsa Philharmonics. Competition honors include First Prizes at the Concert Artists Guild International Competition, UCLA International Piano Competition, and Palm Beach Invitational International Piano Competition, in addition to the Silver Medal and Audience Favorite Prize at the Gina Bachauer International Piano Competition. He has collaborated with the American, Pacifica, Miami and Escher String Quartets and has been a guest artist at numerous festivals. In addition, he appears in recital in the Cheng-Chow Trio with pianists Angela Cheng and his twin brother Alvin Chow. He has given masterclasses throughout North America, Europe and Asia at conservatories, universities, and summer festivals and is an active juror for piano competitions in the US, China, and Singapore. Chow has served as guest professor at the Central Conservatory in Beijing, honored visiting professor at the Shenyang Conservatory, and Visiting Associate Professor at Oberlin Conservatory. He has also presented masterclasses for the conservatories in Shanghai, Chengdu, Wuhan and Xian. Chow graduated Co-Valedictorian (with his brother) at the University of Maryland, where he studied with Nelita True. At the Juilliard School, he studied with Sasha Gorodnitzki and at Indiana University, he was a student of Menahem Pressler. Formerly on the artist faculty at Northwestern University's Bienen School of Music, Chow currently teaches and is Chair of the Piano Department at the Eastman School of Music. ALVIN CHOW has appeared throughout North America and Asia as orchestral soloist and recitalist. In addition, he has performed extensively in duo-piano recitals with his wife, Angela Cheng, and his twin brother, Alan. A native of Miami, Florida, he graduated summa cum laude and Co-Valedictorian (with his brother) at the University of Maryland, where he was a student of Nelita True. Mr. Chow received the Victor Herbert Prize in Piano upon graduation from the Juilliard School, where he studied with Sascha Gorodnitzki, and held the Joseph Battista Memorial Scholarship at Indiana University as a student of Menahem Pressler. Mr. Chow has been presented as recitalist in such cities as Hong Kong, Shanghai, Vienna, Montreal, Toronto, New York, and Los Angeles, and has appeared as soloist with the National Symphony Orchestra, Colorado Symphony, Alabama Symphony, Civic Orchestra of Chicago, Pan-Asia Symphony in Hong Kong, Shanghai Philharmonic, and the Mozarteum Orchestra in Salzburg, among others. Mr. Chow has presented numerous master classes and lectures at music institutions throughout the United States and abroad, including the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto, Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts, Colburn School, Eastman School of Music, and Indiana University, He has taught and performed at numerous summer festivals, including the Shanghai Piano Festival, Banff Piano Master Classes, Rebecca Penneys Piano Festival, Southeastern Piano Festival, Adamant Music School, Classical Music Festival in Eisenstadt, Austria, and the Lake Como Summer Piano School in Italy. Formerly on the faculty at the University of Colorado-Boulder, Mr. Chow has been a member of the artist faculty at the Oberlin Conservatory of Music since 1999. He currently serves as Chair of the Piano Department. From 2011-14 he was the Ruth Strickland Gardner Professor of Music, and was awarded Oberlin's Excellence in Teaching Award in 2016. oberlin.edu/alvin-chow



Pianist, composer and researcher, CATARINA DOMENICI is a Full Professor at the Federal University at Rio Grande do Sul, Brazil, where she teaches both graduate and postgraduate levels. She received a Master and a Doctoral degree from the Eastman School of Music, where she served as an assistant to Professor Rebecca Penneys, and was awarded the Performer's Certificate and the Lizzie Teege Mason award. She has received scholarships from the Chautauqua Institution and the Brazilian Government Agency for the Development of Science (CNPq), and was a post-doctoral fellow at the University at Buffalo. Her research on composer-performer interactions in contemporary music has been published and presented in international symposiums in Asia, Europe, and South America. She is a frequent guest speaker at national symposiums and international institutions, and has served as faculty in several music festivals in Brazil and abroad. As a pianist she has performed in England, Italy, Spain, Portugal, Uruguay, Guatemala, Costa Rica, Brazil and the US, and has received several prizes as a soloist and chamber musician for her performances and recordings. As a composer, she received commissions from King's College London, Fundação Theatro Municipal de São Paulo, Santo Andre Symphony Orchestra, and her works have been performed by USP Symphony Orchestra, Federal University of Paraiba Symphony Orchestra, Porto Alegre Symphony Orchestra, and Santa Maria Symphony Orchestra. Her chamber and piano solo works have been presented in Germany, Italy, England, Brazil, and the USA. Catarina Domenici is a leading figure in the Brazilian musical scene. catarinadomenici.com



Ukrainian-born American pianist INNA FALIKS is renowned for her commanding performances of standard piano repertoire, as well as genre-bending interdisciplinary projects, and inquisitive work with contemporary composers. She has appeared around the world in recital and with major orchestras, performing with conductors Leonard Slatkin, Keith Lockhart and many others. Recent seasons include performances at Ravinia Festival in Chicago, National Gallery in Washington DC, Chigiana Academy in Italy, as soloist with US orchestras nation-wide, and repeated tours of all the major venues in China. Faliks collaborates with and premieres music by some of today's most significant composers, including Billy Childs, Richard Danielpour, Timo Andres, and Clarice Assad. She founded the award-winning poetry-music series Music/Words in 2008, with performances in New York, Chicago, and Los Angeles, both on stage and on WFMT radio. She regularly tours her monologue-recital Polonaise-Fantasie, the Story of a Pianist, which tells the story of her immigration with music by Bach, Chopin, Gershwin, and Carter (recorded on Delos). Faliks' discography includes Reimagine: Beethoven & Ravel (Navona, 2021), for which she commissioned nine composers to respond to Beethoven's Bagatelles op 126 and Ravel's Gaspard de la Nuit. Also released in 2021 (MSR Classics) is The Schumann Project, Volume 1, which includes Clara Schumann's G minor sonata and Robert Schumann's Symphonic Etudes opus 13. Other releases include all-Beethoven and Rachmaninoff/Ravel/Pasternak discs for MSR Classics, and The Master and Margarita project, featuring three world premieres on Sono Luminus (2022). Faliks is professor and head of Piano Studies at UCLA, and in demand worldwide as a masterclass artist and adjudicator. She has articles and essays appearing in Los Angeles Times and The Washington Post. A musical memoir, titled Weight in the Fingertips, will be published in 2023 by Globe Pequot. Composer **KENNETH FRAZELLE's** music has been commissioned and performed by numerous prominent artists, including Yo-Yo Ma, Jeffrey Kahane, Dawn Upshaw, Anthony Dean Griffey, Emmanuel Ax, the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center, Ransom Wilson, Paula Robison, John Adams, the Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra, Jan DeGaetani and Gilbert Kalish. He has received commissions from Music@Menlo, the Ravinia Festival and the Spoleto Festival. Frazelle first received international acclaim with his score for Still/Here, a multimedia dance theater work for the Bill T.Jones/Arnie Zane Dance Company. Frazelle has received awards and fellowships from the American Academy of Arts and Letters, the American Academy in Rome, and Columbia University, and he was the winner of the 2001 Barlow Prize, the international competition administered through Brigham Young University. Student Biographies

Dongqin Yu is a third-year student studying for a Bachelor of Music degree with Professor Soyeon Kate Lee at the University of Cincinnati. She is 21 years old. Dongqin has received such scholarships as the Bertha Langhorst Werner Scholarship, Gorno Voice Scholarship, Bertha Krehbiel Scholarship, and Freda Kaufman Shocket Memorial Scholarship. In the summer of 2022 she participated in the Bowdoin Music Festival and performed in the Bowdoin International Music Festival Concert Series. In November, she played a solo recital. She has received several awards, including 3rd Prize in the Young Artist Group, 1st Prize in Group-G of the 1st New York Manhanville Piano Competition Finals, a Merit Award in the Professional 3rd Group of the Zhujiang Kayserburg International Youth Piano Competition Finals, and Outstanding Winner in the Professional Group of the 12th Shanghai International Youth Piano Competition. Dongqin started her piano journey in July 2005 with Dr. Suirong Li, her first piano teacher.
